# **Novice LD**

## Things to Remember

#### 1. Time Limits

- a. 1<sup>st</sup> Affirmative Constructive 6 minutes
- b. Cross-Examination 3 minutes
- c. 1<sup>st</sup> Negative Constructive 7 minutes
- d. Cross-Examination 3 minutes
- e. 1<sup>st</sup> Affirmative Rebuttal 4 minutes
- f. 1<sup>st</sup> Negative Rebuttal 6 minutes
- g. 2<sup>nd</sup> Affirmative Rebuttal 3 minutes
- h. PREP TIME each side has 4 minutes of prep time, divided as they choose

#### 2. Basics

- a. Extend If your opponent drops (fails to respond) to an argument, EXTEND it and say why it matters
- b. Connect to Value/Criterion this is how your worldview...relate everything back to it
- c. Attack your opponent's value/criterion Either:
  - i. Say why your val/crit is just better
  - ii. Say how you meet their val/crit better than they do
  - iii. Say that your val/crit is a prerequisite to get their val/crit...so look there first
- d. **Remember the power of definitions** typically forgotten thing in Novice LD...watch for sneaky definitions that aren't common usage...and use/abuse definitions to your advantage if your defs are not attacked

#### e. Common Attacks:

- i. No link Opp fails to connect contention to their value/criterion or topic area
- ii. No warrant Opp fails to provide evidence/reasoning to believe point
- iii. No impact Even if opponent's argument is true, it has no impact on the round...the argument doesn't prove the resolution true/false.
- iv. No brightline There is no way to weigh this in round. Example: Max life how much life?
- v. TURN This helps me more than it does them
- f. **Multiple attacks per item on Opponent's case** as many as you can, while providing warranted reasoning for the attack.
- g. Defend against every attack by either:
  - i. Answering each point they opponent brings up
  - ii. Grouping their responses to a contention and responding to all at once

### 3. Flowing

- a. Get the following:
  - i. Definitions
  - ii. Value
  - iii. Criterion
  - iv. Contentions, with emphasis on claim, author/date, and gist of argument
- b. **If you miss something, ask for their case in CX**...don't read the whole thing, just ask what the warrant/justification is for each point you missed.
